



HOW CAN YOU SPOT IF SOMEONE MAY BE VULNERABLE AND BEING **EXPLOITED** OR **TRAFFICKED**?

There are various **key indicators** to look for:

- Guests refusing to leave credit card imprint and insists paying in cash
- Guests requesting a room that is isolated and appear secretive about their visit
- Last minute walk-in bookings **or** booking made in different names than those checking-in
- Guests trying to conceal who they are with
- Guests who specifically request the room is not visited
- Guests with a young person who appears nervous, withdrawn or fearful and acts upon instruction. Potentially disorientated or restricted from moving/communicating.
- Young people with significantly older partners
- Young girls who appear overly made up (make-up/clothing) inappropriately for their age
- Young people loitering in public areas / external areas of premises
- Numerous visitors to a room at regular intervals with no details of the booking
- Individuals who appear to be monitoring public areas
- Ordering alcohol to a room with (perceived) underage people
- Neighbouring guests complaining about noise from the guests' room

ONE SIGN ON ITS OWN DOES NOT MEAN SOMEONE HAS BEEN SEXUALLY EXPLOITED OR TRAFFICKED, BUT SEVERAL SIGNS TOGETHER SHOULD GIVE YOU CAUSE FOR CONCERN.

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There are various **key indicators** to look for:

- Rooms with signs of sexual activity
- Guest rooms with a lot of condoms/condom wrappers
- Guest rooms with evidence of drug usage/drug paraphernalia (e.g. syringes, wraps, pipes, bongs, broken light bulbs, spoons, plastic bags, antiseptic wipes, prescription / over the counter drugs)
- Guests who refuse to have their room cleaned
- A hospitality suite with business men and young people (adults may be there for an event, conference or meeting).

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
