

CYP Safeguarding Training Guidance

All managers and practitioners working directly with children and families should attend Safeguarding training to attain and maintain group 4 safeguarding competencies – in accordance with Working Together to Safeguard Children, 2015. To attain group 4 competencies, staff must attend 1 or 2 days of training around key areas of safeguarding practice.

All CYP health managers and practitioners working directly with children and families should attend Safeguarding training to attain and maintain level 3 and beyond safeguarding competencies, according to the Safeguarding Children and Young People: roles and competences for health care staff INTERCOLLEGIATE DOCUMENT. To attain CYP Health level 3 safeguarding competencies, staff must complete minimum 6 hours Safeguarding training, each year.
