



Vulnerable to Radicalisation (VTR) Referral Process

VTR referral completed and emailed to the Multi Agency Safeguarding Hub (MASH)
mash@suffolk.pnn.police.uk



VTR referral sent to Prevent Team
For assessment to determine referral is not malicious, misinformed or involves illegality and submit Police Information Report (PIR) for Fixed Intelligence Management Unit (FIMU)



FIMU complete assessment/deconfliction* checks and send back to Prevent for further assessment.
If decision made to progress then Prevent Team will contact MASH for full agency checks



MASH (Police) Send to Customer First .
MASH complete full agency checks and send updated VTR referral to Prevent Team



Suitability assessment made with Channel Panel Chair



Channel Panel held to determine suitability



Collective assessment of support needs based on risk and suitability:
Develop action plan – identify and procure appropriate support package and review



Delivery of support
